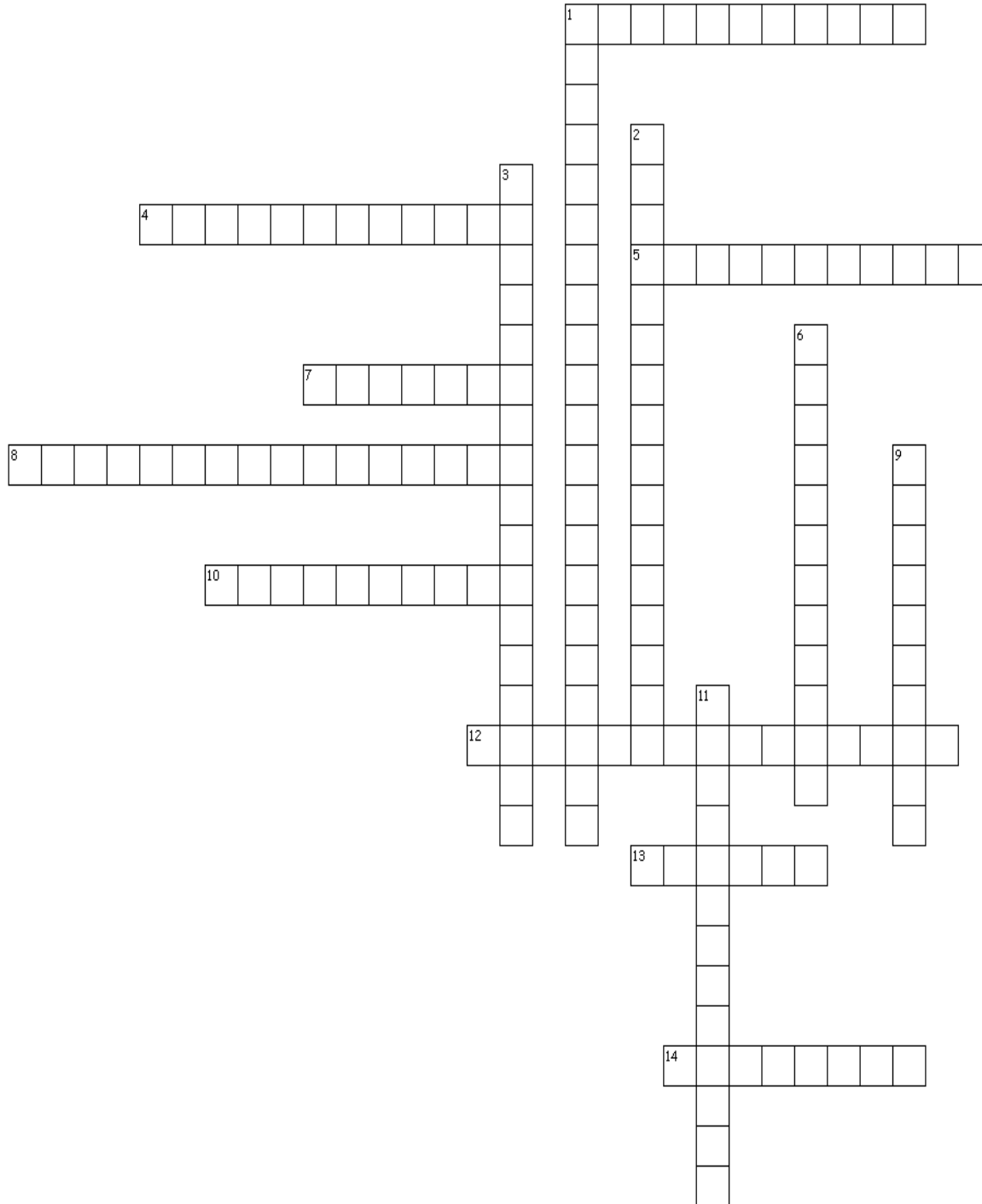


Curtains SCRIPT REFERENCES CROSSWORD

- 7) French actor and playwright, considered the greatest of all writers of French comedy
- 8) A Russian ballet dancer, regarded as the foremost contemporary choreographer in the world of ballet
- 10) A play by the Greek playwright Aristophanes in which the women of Athens decide to withhold sex from their husbands until the war is ended
- 12) A four-act tragedy written by Eugene O'Neill focusing on the psychological and emotional problems of derelicts who sustain themselves with baseless hopes for a better tomorrow
- 13) An existentialist one-act play by Jean-Paul Sartre about three antagonizing characters trapped in Hell
- 14) Rodgers and Hammerstein's first collaboration; a musical about the pioneering men and women of the American Southwest

- 2) Author of the famous *Sherlock Holmes* novels and short stories
- 3) Irish dramatist, literary critic, a socialist spokesman, and a leading figure in the 20th century theater

- 9) Legendary star of Broadway musical theater during the '40s and '50s; famous for playing Peter Pan
- 11) Irish novelist and playwright, famous for absurdist plays such as *Waiting for Godot*
