It is operated by Arts United of Greater Fort Wayne with offices at 300 E. Main Street, Fort Wayne IN 46802. Inquiries about use of the Theatre should be directed to Arts Campus Administration at 260-424-0646.

Special Accommodations: Wheelchair seating locations are available. Please request special seating when purchasing your tickets. Inquire at the box office for use of listening device for the hearing impaired.

Food and Beverages: Concession service is available in the lobbies before the show and during intermissions. Indiana law prohibits the sale of alcoholic beverages to minors. 



JOHN O'CONNELL

A production two years in the making. The designs were complete, the cast was set, and we were one week out from starting rehearsal when the pandemic hit and our nation shut down. I guess that was better than one week out from performance. This was the end of our production hopes. Skip to a year later, the Phillip Colglazier asks me if I think we'd like to remount the production two years later and I was more than eager to get on board. We had hoped for the same cast and they were onboard until...well...babies got in the way. Cast members and our stage manager all decided to have babies. Alas, while we missed them, we were fortunate to recast with terrific local actors excited to take on the most difficult comedy EVER WRITTEN.

This farce by Michael Frayn, for me, is the most difficult play I have ever directed and after doing it once before, I said I'd never go near it again. I guess, never say never, right? Here I am again with this terrific group of people working on a farce that requires intricate timing, ridiculously fastpaced physical action, dialects, and all the actors playing two characters each for this play within a play. During rehearsal, we are regularly thrilled and exhilarated while at the same time terrified and overwhelmed. The reason this comedy is one of the most performed in history has to do with the over-the-top, ridiculous nature of the events that befall this troupe of actors that make this the pinnacle of all British farces in the last 50 years. And, the most difficult play all of us have attempted in quite some time. Tracking the plates of sardines and the whiskey bottle alone is driving actors and stage managers to the brink.

I am so grateful that the excellent design team from the Civic Theatre saved all the work we did two years ago in preparing for that production. This made the design process easy and ready to start where we left off. The two-story set alone is a feat of grand scenic design, not accounting for the fact we have to turn this behemoth around...twice. The period costumes have been great fun to design allowing us to review old fashion catalogs from the late 60's and early 70's. And the props....well, sardines, sardines and more sardines and the doors, lots of doors. As Lloyd the director says, *"That's what it's all about. Doors and sardines. Getting the sardines on – getting the sardines off. That's farce. That's the theatre. That's life." Well, welcome to our madcap-farcical life of <i>Noises Off*!





ABOUT MICHAEL FRAYN





Michael Frayn (Author) Playwright, novelist, and translator Michael Frayn was born in London on September 8, 1933. After two years of National Service, during which he learned Russian, he read Philosophy at Emmanuel College, Cambridge. He worked as a reporter and columnist for *The Guardian* and *The Observer*, publishing several novels including *The Tin Men* (1965), winner of a Somerset Maugham Award, *The Russian Interpreter* (1966), which won the Hawthornden Prize, and *Towards the End of the Morning* (1967). Other novels include *A Landing on the Sun* (1991) and *Headlong* (1999), the story of the discovery of a lost painting by Bruegel, shortlisted for

the Booker Prize for Fiction. Spies (2002), a story of childhood set in England during the Second World War, won the 2002 Whitbread Novel Award and the 2003 Commonwealth Writers Prize, and was shortlisted for the Whitbread Book of the Year. Michael Frayn is the recipient of the 2002 Heywood Hill Literary Prize. His plays include Alphabetical Order (1975), Clouds (1976), Donkeys' Years (1977), Make or Break (1980), Noises Off (1982) and Benefactors (1984). *Copenhagen* (1998), about the 1941 meeting between German physicist Werner Heisenberg and his Danish counterpart Niels Bohr, first staged at the Royal National Theatre in London, won the 1998 Evening Standard Award for Best Play of the Year and the 2000 Tony Award for Best Play. His play Democracy (2003) is set in 1960s Berlin. His latest play for the Royal National Theatre is Afterlife (2008). Recent books are Stage Directions: Writing on Theatre 1970-2008 (2008), and Travels with a Typewriter (2009). A book of memoir, My Father's Fortune: A Life, was published in 2010, was shortlisted for the 2010 Costa Biography Award, and won the 2011 PEN/Ackerley Prize. He has also translated a number of works from Russian, including plays by Chekhov and Tolstoy. His films for television include First and Last (1989), for which he won an Emmy, and an adaptation of his 1991 novel A Landing on the Sun. He also wrote the screenplay for the film Clockwise (1986), a comedy starring John Cleese. Frayn is married to the biographer and critic Claire Tomalin.



The art, process and effects of live performance are incredibly important in the current world of social media, digital technology and screens. Being fully present with a group of tangible, living, breathing people is important to the art of acting and for the human spirit.

1) Theatre helps us to see a different perspective from our own. We're shown humanity, psychology, motivation, conflict and resolution. Theatre encourages us to give power to truth, to take Eunice Wadewitz risks, and to advocate for new and diverse voices.

2) Theatre reminds us that we are not alone. Not only are we sharing space and an experience with the artists who are

performing, we are sharing the experience with fellow audience members. Movies and television don't have the same intimacy or sense of participation. Sharing an experience with live actors and live audience members is not only valuable, it's necessary for human connection.

3) Theatre is immediate, evolving and always different. Although the script may be the same every night, the performance is unique each and every time it happens. No two performances are ever the same. In this way, everyone involved has a distinct and unique experience that can never be replicated.

4) Live theatre helps to promote social discourse, dialogue, and potential social change. Theatre is a cultural phenomenon that demands that society examines itself in the mirror. We can study societal problems and attempt to find solutions. Coming together as a community to listen to opposing points of view is necessary.

5) Theatre promotes education and literacy. Studies have shown that students who participate in theatre do better in school.
