

DIRECTOR'S NOTES - JOHN TOLLEY



Welcome to the French countryside at the end of the Baroque era in the eighteenth century. With Civic Theatre's production of *Beauty and the Beast*, you are invited into the Disney fairy tale of a young woman on a quest for meaning in life beyond the confines of her small, rural village, and the "Beast" she discovers in an enchanted castle. All of the pillars of great story-telling are here: the passion for adventure, the importance of family, the meaning of the fearsome forest through which the travelers must journey, the courage to

confront the unknown, the triumph of love and understanding over fear mongering and deceit. All the ingredients create this hallmark of a perfect fairy tale. What is unexpected is how relevant this fantasy is to the times through which we are living.

Fairy tales are one way a culture tells the story of the values it holds dear. Those values identify the history that the culture bequeaths to future generations. And as history has often illustrated, those who ignore it are doomed to repeat it. This fairy tale offers us wisdom that addresses these times in which we are living.

In touching revelation, Belle and the Beast discover they have at least one important aspect of their lives in common: they are outsiders; he a Beast whose appearance makes him an object of scorn and fear, she an odd, bookish girl who stubbornly refuses to step into the societal roles her community demands and respects in its women. They are "other-ed" by the people of the village, to be avoided, to be feared and ultimately to be eliminated. The most haunting lyric for this director in the whole production is when the townspeople sing in anger as Gaston incites their fear: "We don't like what we don't understand. In fact, it scares us... Bring your guns; bring your knives... We'll save our village and our lives. We'll kill the Beast."

The man who wrote those stirring lyrics was Howard Ashman. While he was creating this loving fantasy with musicians Alan Menken and Tim Rice, he was dying of AIDS, a secret he kept from his colleagues until just before the animated film was released. He died in 1991, posthumously winning the Academy Award for the title song, "Beauty and the Beast." It is not difficult to imagine that Howard Ashman was writing out of his own life experience; frightened into silence because of the misapprehension and fear of his disease. He was an "other-ed" outsider in the early years of a misunderstood epidemic, just as Native Americans were "other-ed" by European settlers, African slaves by the Confederate establishment, Jews by the twentieth-century Nazi regime, and Muslims by a wary, western, contemporary world.

If there is any plea that this family-friendly, sentimental fairy tale carries to those who experience it, it is this: despite all of our dissimilarities, we are far more alike than we are different. Getting to know what we don't understand is the honorable way to bridge differences and build respect. To see ourselves in the eyes of others whose life expressions are unlike our own is the challenge offered to people of integrity by a complex Beast, a beautiful young girl, enchanted objects in a magic castle in this once upon a time fairy tale.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES - JOHN TOLLEY

It has truly been an honor for me as Director to work with such gifted performers. You will delight in the evidence of this as you experience the multi-talented cast sing, dance and act their ways into your hearts. But equally important are the artists behind the scenes. Leslie Beauchamp's choreography sparkles as brightly as her warm personality and her love of the theater. Eunice Wadewitz's musical skill and sensitivity are unmatched in this city's rich culture, and Adam Fletcher's set design and Corey Lee's technical design are as fine as you will discover in any theater across the country. The support of our stage managers, costume designers, sound, properties and publicity design are invaluable and as professional as one would find anywhere. In deepest humility, I sincerely thank them. Creating Beauty and the Beast together with them has been extraordinarily joyful work.

So, let me encourage you to suspend your disbelief while experiencing this "tale as old as time," and be moved by its critical message wrapped up in all the ingredients of a perfect fairy tale. Fort Wayne's finest talents on-stage and back stage, have prepared it for you with joy, and in that spirit, we offer it back to you.

JOHN TOLLEY (DIRECTOR) is an Affiliate Professor of Arts in Ministry at Meadville Lombard Theological School at the University of Chicago. Before his tenure in Chicago, he served religious congregations for twenty-two years, beginning as the Minister of Drama/Artistic Director at First Presbyterian Theater here in Fort Wayne. Subsequently, he served churches in Memphis, Tennessee, Montclair, New Jersey, and Westport, Connecticut. He holds a PhD in Educational Theatre from New York University and has taught in that discipline at NYU, the City University of New York (CUNY), Goshen College and now at Meadville Lombard. His portfolio includes over one-hundred-twenty dramatic productions, one recent one being the well-received production of The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee which he directed for Civic Theatre's 2014-2015 season. Academically, he has also published on the topics of religious education, religious art and ministry and LGBTQ issues. John is honored to be directing again for Fort Wayne Civic Theatre and delighted to be working with such a young, talented and energetic cast and crew.

Learning in and through the arts can even help students overcome the obstacles of disadvantaged backgrounds." Businesses understand that arts education helps

youth develop a positive work ethic and pride in a job well done, can help troubled youth by providing an alternative to destructive behavior, and aid youth to develop a sense of craftsmanship, quality task performance and goal-setting.

Children find that the theater can offer an emotional safe haven from family turmoil, that achievement in the art and friendships built during the show process embolden them as they enter new situations of various kinds, that their performances bring the broader community together in pride, that their horizons are expanded through trips to theaters outside of their immediate neighborhoods, and that they get a glimpse of the wide-ranging cultural world. All of this leads to a confidant, self-motivated youth, empowered with life skills that create a self-reliant person who is successful in school, work, and life. As adults, these same individuals become assets to their community, having learned and developed many skills which they need in order to live and work in a society, and are highly employable.

In short, the arts are as much a part of a child's development and success as they are a part of a successful and enlightened society.

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




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
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
