

- 1) Theatre helps us to see a different perspective from our own. We're shown humanity, psychology, motivation, conflict and resolution. Theatre encourages us to give power to truth, to take risks, and to advocate for new and diverse voices.
- 2) Theatre reminds us that we are not alone. Not only are we sharing space and an experience with the artists who are performing, we are sharing the experience with fellow audience members. Movies and television don't have the same intimacy or sense of participation. Sharing an experience with live actors and live audience members is not only valuable, it's necessary for human connection.
- 3) Theatre is immediate, evolving and always different. Although the script may be the same every night, the performance is unique each and every time it happens. No two performances are ever the same. In this way, everyone involved has a distinct and unique experience that can never be replicated.
- 4) Live theatre helps to promote social discourse, dialogue, and potential social change. Theatre is a cultural phenomenon that demands that society examines itself in the mirror. We can study societal problems and attempt to find solutions. Coming together as a community to listen to opposing points of view is necessary.
- 5) Theatre promotes education and literacy. Studies have shown that students who participate in theatre do better in school.





DIRECTOR'S NOTES

CAPRI PARRISH WILLIAMS



In the fall of 1987, *Into The Woods* opened on Broadway. The road to this successful opening was long and actually started at Playwrights Horizon as a workshop in the summer of 1986. The production contained no sets, no costumes, just a piano bench and lots of baseball hats. The baseball hats had signs on them specifying a character's name and the performers would change hats once they changed roles. To imagine this sophisticated musical in this simplest form speaks loudly to the fact of the magic, the music,

and the importance that Stephen Sondheim and James Lapine created.

As we sat down to start collaborating on this production, the Creative Team decided to add one more character to our show, the Woods. The Woods itself drives the narrative along, it is a living being that if we push, it will push back. It can be a scary thing to enter the unknown but as the characters seek and fight for their happily ever after, they find the courage and self-worth to persevere. To not only journey once, but many times to achieve their dreams.

The story of *Into The Woods* contains recognizable characters that the majority of us grew up with. Tales passed down from generation to generation that communicate and teach moral codes, binding society together with a shared concept, lessons of positive and negative behavior and the rewards and punishments that follow. The majority of these tales can be credited to The Brothers Grimm, 2 brothers who spent years collecting folk tales from the people of Hesse in middle Germany. Jacob and Wilhelm Grimm published their first volume of 86 tales gathered "from the lips of the people" in 1812 in Berlin called "Kinder and Hausmarchen" (Young People's and Household Tales). *Into The Woods* opened on the 175th anniversary of the publication.

I dedicate this show to all of those who gave me the courage to enter the Woods, to those who passed on the tales of good and evil, right and wrong, and to those who allowed me to discover strength in myself and my community. We honor you, Stephen Sondheim. Come with us now into this fantastical fairytale adventure where wishes come true, not free.

CAPRI PARRISH WILLIAMS (Director and Choreographer) a native of Edon, Ohio, is an active dance educator, choreographer, and performer in the tri-state area. She received her B.A. in Dance Performance & Choreography from Hope College in Holland, Michigan. Capri is a proud team member of the Fort Wayne Civic Theatre's production of The SpongeBob Musical that recently won the 2023 Arts United Award for Project SpongeBob: Diversity and Inclusion. Local Choreography credits include The Wedding Singer, The SpongeBob Musical (Assistant Director), The Christmas Schooner (Assistant Director), Legally Blonde, Carrie, The Wild Party, How To Succeed..., You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown, The Sound of Music, and Grease. Local performance credits include The Wedding Singer (Holly), A Funny Thing Happened...Forum (Vibrata, Anthony Award), Annie (Star to Be), Legally Blonde (Elle Woods, Anthony Award), Sweeney Todd (Ensemble), Mamma Mia! (Sophie), Newsies (Dancer, Anthony Award), and White Christmas (Dancer). STEPHEN SONDHEIM (Music and Lyrics) wrote the music and lyrics for Saturday Night (1954), A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum (1962), Anyone Can Whistle (1964), Company (1970), Follies (1971), A Little Night Music (1973), The Frogs (1974), Pacific Overtures (1976), Sweeney Todd (1979), Merrily We Roll Along (1981), Sunday in the Park With George (1984),

Into The Woods (1987), Assassins (1991), Passion (1994) and Road Show (2008) as well as lyrics for West Side Story (1957), Gypsy (1959) and Do I Hear A Waltz? (1965) and additional lyrics for Candide (1973). Anthologies of his work include Side by Side by Sondheim (1976), Marry Me A Little (1981), You're Gonna Love Tomorrow (1983), Putting It Together (1993/99) and Sondheim on Sondheim (2010). He composed the scores of the films "Stavisky" (1974) and "Reds" (1981) and songs for "Dick Tracy" (1990) and the television production "Evening Primrose" (1966). His collected lyrics with attendant essays have been published in two volumes: "Finishing the Hat" (2010) and "Look, I Made A Hat" (2011). In 2010, Broadway's Henry Miller's Theatre was renamed The Stephen Sondheim Theatre in his honor; in 2019, London's Queens Theatre was also renamed the Sondheim.


