

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

LESLIE BEAUCHAMP



"We hold these truths to be self-evident that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

Arguably the most famous part of the Declaration of Independence, the section that Lincoln referenced in the first sentence of his Gettysburg Address, that Elizabeth Cady Stanton added "and women" to in her Seneca Falls Declaration, and that the Schuyler Sisters belt out in Broadway's *Hamilton*, it is a lens through which

we define human rights - rights we can recognize weren't evenly or fairly considered at the outset, but which we have battled for and continue to fight to claim.

For the past several weeks I have had the privilege of working closely with twenty-six supremely talented and inspiring actresses, researching the lives and circumstances of these truly courageous men who tasked themselves with taking this first step toward forming The United States of America, and the women whose own strength and bravery in that process is too often overshadowed and overlooked. I have most often been asked to comment on what unique obstacles we have encountered during rehearsals for our all female production. With complete honesty and candor I answer, "None." This cast has, conversely, studied these roles and how people lived during that time with an exhaustive scope and intensity. Just as theatre was commonly cast with all male actors dating back to the Ancient Greeks, we approached these traditionally male characters as we would any acting assignment. It has allowed us to focus on the incredible people and story that we present in 1776.

1776 is the classic, TonyAward-winning musical that showcases the determination, the principles, and the pride that shaped and influenced the birth of our nation. Based on letters and memoirs of America's founding fathers and their wives, it has been a delight to watch some of our city's most skilled actresses bring the impassioned debates of Philadelphia's Second Continental Congress to life. We have marveled at the bravery of the boys and men that General George Washington sends updates about from the military front, confronted the hypocrisy of the slavery debate, appreciated the strength and stubbornness required to persuade the thirteen colonies to separate from British rule, and been completely fascinated by the importance of and the process required to produce saltpeter!

While we took a traditional approach in all aspects of rehearsing and presenting 1776, the fact that none of the women portraying these characters or producing this show would have been afforded any of the rights their characters demanded must be acknowledged. We all too often take the world we live in and the way of life we enjoy for granted. To think that the 19th Amendment giving women the right to vote was only ratified 100 years ago, 144 years after the signing of the Declaration, seems somehow surreal. More incredulous yet, it wasn't until the Voting Rights Act of 1965, a mere 55 years ago, that Jim Crow laws, amended state constitutions imposing voting restrictions, and other legal forms of disenfranchisement, were struck down.

As we recognize the astonishing feat, as imperfect as it was – the formation of a new nation - that our renowned founding fathers completed against seemingly insurmountable odds, so too must we appreciate the countless men and women who have since then taken up their baton and continue to work tirelessly - through generations - to form a more perfect union, to secure every citizen of these United States "certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness." Vote.

Last seen onstage as Desiree Armfeldt in Arena's production of A Little Night Music, Leslie is an avid theatre director/choreographer/performer working with all area theatres, as well as Fort Wayne Philharmonic, Ford Theatre at the Honeywell Center, and with the Virginia Symphony Orchestra. In addition to theatrical productions, Leslie has choreographed award winning show choirs throughout Indiana, serves as an adjudicator and motivational clinician, and works as a voice over talent for local, regional, and national companies. Favorite performances include Margaret Johnson in Light in the Piazza, Guinevere in Camelot, the Witch in Into the Woods, Anita in West Side Story, Fanny Brice in Funny Girl, Eliza Doolittle in My Fair Lady, Sally Bowles in Cabaret, Cassie and Sheila in A Chorus Line, and Gypsy Rose Lee in Gypsy. Choreographic works include Cabaret, Jesus Christ Superstar, Hairspray, West Side Story, Sweeney Todd, Godspell, Pump Boys and Dinettes, Dames at Sea, Bye Bye Birdie, All Shook Up, and Legally Blonde.

Councilwoman Sharon Tucker has been serving the insurance community for more than 25 years. A graduate of Indiana Tech, she holds two Bachelors of Science degrees in Management and Human Resources. Sharon's community engagement is extensive. She's a proud member of the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Anthony Wayne Rotary, the AAUW, and the NAACP. Sharon also volunteers on the Board of Directors for the Allen County Public Library and helped launch the Community Housing Development Organization, 'Joshua's Hand,' in 2015, subsequently serving on its Board of Directors. Sharon's civic engagement is extensive having served as the Treasurer for the Allen County Democratic Party for five years and as Vice Chair in 2016. Sharon was elected as 1st District Councilwoman on the Allen County Council in 2014 and was re-elected to a second term in 2018. While on County Council, she was the only female, African American, and Democrat serving at the time. Sharon then ran for the 6th District City Council seat in 2019 and won wherein she continues to make her mark in local politics as the first African American woman to hold this seat. Sharon has long held a desire to help other women achieve their political goals. In 2012, she formed the 'Women in Politics Forum,' an annual forum focusing on empowering, engaging, and educating women on the importance of being involved in the political process. She's also mentored several local female political candidates and especially enjoys public speaking as it relates to women in politics. Finally, Councilwoman Tucker makes time for running a successful e-Commerce business and YouTube Channel - 'Classy Shay Design's' - where she offers affordable craft supplies for do-it-yourself projects as well as custom gifts. Sharon also relishes time with her family and friends.

Nancy McCammon-Hansen, immediate past president of the League of Women Voters of Fort Wayne - was one of the persons who helped bring the League of Women Voters back into existence in Fort Wayne in 2008.
